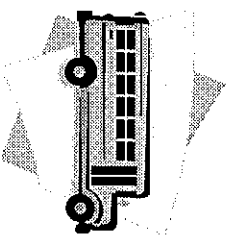
**Parents - Are Your Kids Ready for School?  
Required Immunizations for School Year 2019-2020**

- **Please check the chart on the other side of this page to make sure your child has the required immunizations before school begins in the fall.**
- **If your child is not up to date, vaccines are available at most medical clinics including the Neighborcare school based health clinic at Vashon Island High School. Call (206) 548-7550 to make an appointment. The Vashon Pharmacy can also administer any of the vaccines required for school. To schedule an appointment, call (206) 463-9118.**
- **To enroll your child for school, a signed Certificate of Immunization (CIS) downloaded from the Washington State Department of Health Immunization Registry (called MyIR) is required. If a completed CIS isn't available online, please sign a blank CIS and attach copies of clinical immunization records from your health care provider.**
- **To print your child's immunization certificate from the WA State Immunization Registry, contact the school nurse at (206) 463-8600, ask your doctor or go to: <https://wa.myir.net/>**
- **If a parent/guardian chooses not to immunize for any or all of the required immunizations, a Certificate of Exemption (signed by parent and Health Care Provider) is also required.**

# Parents - Are Your Kids Ready for School?

## Required Immunizations for School Year 2019-2020



**Parent/Guardian Instructions: To see which vaccines are required for school, find your child's grade and look only at that row going across to find the vaccines and number of doses required.**

	<b>Hepatitis B</b>	<b>DTaP/Tdap</b> (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis) Vaccine doses required may be fewer than listed	<b>Polio</b> Vaccine doses required may be fewer than listed	<b>MMR</b> (Measles, Mumps, Rubella)	<b>Varicella</b> (Chickenpox)
<b>Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> Grade</b>	3 doses within the correct timeframes	5 doses within the correct timeframes	4 doses within the correct timeframes	2 doses within the correct timeframes	2 doses within the correct timeframes OR Healthcare provider verified child had disease
<b>6<sup>th</sup> Grade through 12<sup>th</sup> Grade</b>	3 doses within the correct timeframes	5 doses DTaP AND 1 dose Tdap, all within the correct timeframes	4 doses within the correct timeframes	2 doses within the correct timeframes	2 doses within the correct timeframes OR Healthcare provider verified child had disease (Exceptions are allowed for certain students)

- Students must get vaccine doses at correct timeframes to be in compliance with the requirements. Talk to your healthcare provider or school staff if you have questions about school immunization requirements.
